This *Aide Mémoire* contains a detailed description of the organisation and procedures of the Econometric Society within the European Region. It complements the Rules and Procedures of the Econometric Society. It is maintained and regularly updated by the Secretary of the European Standing Committee in accordance with the policies and decisions of the Committee.

1 European Standing Committee

1.1 Responsibilities

1. The European Standing Committee is responsible for the organisation of the activities of the Econometric Society within the Region *Europe and Other Areas*.¹ It should undertake the consideration of any activities in the Region that promote interaction among those interested in the objectives of the Society, as they are stated in its Constitution.

2. The Standing Committee is responsible for establishing regular and systematic procedures for the organisation of

- (a) the Econometric Society European Meeting (ESEM), and
- (b) the European Winter Meeting of the Econometric Society (EWMES).

The Econometric Society European Meeting is held annually except for those years in which there is a World Congress. The European Winter Meeting is held each year.

3. The Standing Committee selects the dates and locations of ESEM and EWMES, and appoints the Programme and Local Arrangements Chairs. These decisions should customarily be taken at least one year and a half for EWMES and two years in advance for ESEM, so that those responsible for future meetings have sufficient time to make the necessary arrangements.

Some time before the Standing Committee Meeting the Secretary sends a list of candidates that have been mentioned as potential Programme Chairs at previous meetings to the members of the Committee. This allows the members acquiring more detailed information about the candidates and suggesting new names in time. Any proposals for candidates for Programme Chairs should be accompanied by a recent CV or a reference to a homepage.

The Standing Committee also determines (a) the number of days the meeting should last, (b) whether the meeting is to be held jointly with other Societies, (c) service functions to be delegated to other organisations, and (d) the scheduling of meetings of members to be held during the regional meeting.

1.2 Membership

The members of the European Standing Committee of the Econometric Society are the following:²

Voting members:

- *Chair*: The first of the following list who resides in Europe and Other Areas:
 - The President of the Society
 - The First Vice-President
 - The Second Vice-President
 - The Past President

If none of these resides in the Region, the President will appoint a European member of the Council of the Society to act as Chair.

- *Ex Officio Members*: Any other Officer of the Society on the above list who resides in Europe and Other Areas.
- *European Members* of the Council of the Society.
- *Five Elected Members* chosen by the members of the Society in the Region as stipulated in the rules and regulations of the Society.

Elected members serve a non-renewable term of four years. If any elected member quits prior to the regular end of his/her term, the number of persons to be elected in a given year increases correspondingly.

The Executive Vice-President and the Secretary are in charge of collecting nominations. If n members are to be elected in a given year and more than $6n$ candidates have been nominated, the voting members of the Committee conduct one round of approval voting so as to reduce the list to no more than $6n$ candidates (this is done by email). Also by email, voting members subsequently vote à la Borda on these $6n$ or fewer candidates. The $2n$ best-placed persons are asked whether they agree to stand for election. In the event of a refusal, the next-placed person on the list is asked. The Society then presents the $2n$ candidates to the constituency and organises the election.

Non-voting members:

- *Secretary*: Appointed by the Committee for a term of three years (beginning at August 1 of the first year). The appointment can be renewed up to a maximum of three terms.

A Search Committee for a Secretary is constituted by the Chair of the Standing Committee at least one year and a half before renewal and consists of the current Secretary and Treasurer, the Executive Vice-President of the Econometric Society (as a non-voting member) and possibly other members of the Standing Committee. The Search Committee selects a list of candidates and approval of this list is sought with the Standing Committee at the meeting one year before renewal.

In case of any event preventing the current Secretary to accomplish her/his duties, a Search Committee is constituted, a list of candidates is ranked and the candidates are approached by the Chair in the order of the list to see if they are willing to serve. This candidate is then proposed to the Standing Committee for approval.

- *Treasurer*: Appointed by the Committee for a term of three years (beginning August 1 of the first year), which should not coincide with that of the Secretary. The appointment can be renewed up to a maximum of three terms.

The selection process of a Treasurer follows the same guidelines described above as for the Secretary.

- *Programme Chairs* in Theoretical and Applied Economics (TAE) and Econometrics and Empirical Economics (EEE) for ESEM of the past, the current and the following year.³
- *Programme Chairs* for EWMES of the current and the past year.⁴
- The *Econometric Society Representative for Women in Economics*.

In addition,

- the President (if not residing in the Region),
- the Executive Vice-President,
- the General Manager of the Society, and
- the Editor of *Econometrica*

are invited to attend the meetings of the European Standing Committee.

Note: Local Arrangements Chairs for the Meetings of the current and the following year have been members of the European Standing Committee until 2012. To avoid repetition of presentations in different committees it has been decided that from 2013 their presence will be requested at the Joint EEA/ES Congress Committee only. Their reports to the Standing Committee are summarized by the Secretary. Questions by members of the Standing Committee are relayed by the Secretary to the Joint Congress Committee.

1.3 Procedures

1. The *Chair* of the Standing Committee is responsible for arranging meetings of the Committee and communicating the decisions of the Committee to the General Manager of the Society. The Committee meets annually. In years of an Econometric Society European Meeting its meeting is held at the same site, and in the other years usually at the site of the World Congress

If the President of the Society is not present, the Chair of the Standing Committee chairs the meetings of members held during ESEM and is responsible for the agenda.

When ESEM is planned to be held jointly with the Congress of the EEA (European Economic Association) two years ahead, the Chair communicates in the beginning of the year with the Vice-President of the EEA about the available options for congress locations.

2. The *Secretary* actively collaborates with the Chair and the Treasurer in dealing with all issues facing the Standing Committee. He/she is responsible for invitations to the meetings of the Standing Committee and, in conjunction with the Chair, prepares the agenda and supporting memoranda. He/she takes minutes at the meetings of the Committee.

The Secretary maintains correspondence between the members of the Committee, the Executive Vice-President, and the General Manager of the Society. He/she liaises with the Programme Chairs and the Local Arrangement Chairs with regard to their arrangements for ESEM.

3. The *Treasurer* manages the European fund of the Society in liaison with the Executive Vice-President. He/she authorises expenditures and collects the funds owed to the European fund in accordance with the policies of the Standing Committee. He/she prepares a written annual report about the state of the fund for the Committee.

4. The *Programme Chairs* of ESEM are responsible for organising the Plenary and Parallel Invited Sessions and the Contributed Sessions of the Meeting. They are entirely free to arrange the programme as they see fit, subject to the structural constraints of ESEM and EEA if the meeting is joint. This includes lunch slots over the whole period of the conference. The Programme Chairs of the previous, the current, and the following year are expected to attend the Standing

Committee Meeting to facilitate the transmission of information about organising the programme. The Programme Chairs of the current year provide a written report to the Standing Committee which summarizes their arrangements.

5. The *Programme Chair* of EWMES is responsible for organising the Plenary Sessions and the Contributed Sessions of the Meeting with the help of Program Committee Members. The Chair is entirely free to arrange the programme as s/he sees fit, subject to the structural constraints of EWMES. The Programme Chairs of the previous and the current year are expected to attend the Standing Committee Meeting to facilitate the transmission of information about organising the programme. The Programme Chair of the current year provides a written report to the Standing Committee which summarizes their arrangements.⁵

6. The *Local Arrangements Chairs* of ESEM and of EWMES are responsible for arranging the physical facilities, accommodation, meals, and social events. They collaborate with Programme Chairs to arrange the meeting website, which should contain registration and programme information. The local website should be linked to the “Future Meetings” section of the Society’s website. The Local Arrangements Chairs of the current year provide a written report about the local arrangements to the Standing Committee (EWMES) or the Joint Congress Committee (ESEM/EEA).

2 Econometric Society European Meeting (ESEM)

2.1 Timing and Format

Since 2003 the European Meeting of the Econometric Society (ESEM) and the Congress of the EEA are held in parallel, rather than one after the other as in the years before.⁶

The joint meetings (EEA–ESEM) are usually held in late August and last for 4 – 4.5 days. Detailed information about the structure of past meetings is available on the Society’s website, which provides a list of previous meetings with links to their local websites.⁷

Since 2011 the ES and EEA have formed a Congress Committee that meets twice a year, first in the spring at the location of the EEA Council Meeting and second, at the yearly congress. The Chair, Secretary and Treasurer of the ES European Standing Committee attend those Congress Committee meetings. Programme chairs provide a written report to this Committee and are invited to participate.

The members of the EEA Council and the ES European Standing Committee are encouraged to contact colleagues who might be interested in acting as local organiser of a future EEA-ESEM congress. Proposals to host a meeting should specify the physical facilities available for sessions, accommodation and meal arrangements, and social events, as well as an estimated budget that includes total costs and revenues (from registration fees and from other sources). They should be submitted to the Secretaries of the two organisations, who can provide further information.

The Secretaries of the two societies will coordinate the search for at least one and preferably two candidates as early as possible. Ideally, between the summer of year $t - 3$ and the end of that year they will put together a preliminary list of potential candidates for year t if ESEM is planned to be held jointly with the Congress of the EEA. At the beginning of year $t - 2$, the Chair of the ES European Standing Committee communicates with the Vice-President of the EEA about the available options for congress locations.

Future venues for the joint meetings are discussed in the spring of year $t - 2$ at the Congress Committee. The ES European Standing Committee takes its formal decision at its meeting in August of year $t - 2$. Officers from both associations will regularly meet at the joint summer meetings to discuss matters related to the cooperation between the societies.

The *Local Arrangements Chair (LAC)* for the current and the following EEA-ESEM congress is invited to the meeting of the Joint ES/EEA Congress Committee. He/she is responsible for arranging the physical facilities, accommodation, meals, and social events. He/she collaborates with the Programme Chairs to arrange the meeting website, which should contain registration and Programme information. The local website should be linked to the “Future Meetings” section of the Society’s website. The Chair of the current year provides a written *report* about the local arrangements to the Joint Congress Committee.

2.2 Invited Sessions

The Programme Chairs are responsible for inviting the speakers and chairs of the Plenary and Parallel Invited Sessions.⁸ They also decide about whether to invite discussants for the Parallel Invited Sessions. In their arrangements they should take into consideration that the European Standing Committee aims to promote the participation of women in ESEM.

Presidential Address

The Presidential Address takes place on the second day of the conference. The President of the Society is invited for the lecture by the Programme Chairs. The Presidential Address is a plenary ‘A-session’ of EEA–ESEM, i.e. there are no other sessions or events at the same time. There are no discussants of the Presidential Address, and it is customary that the Past President of the Society chairs the session.

It has been customary since 2013 to have the presentation of the winners of the Econometric Society award for the best applied paper of young researchers before the Presidential Address. The winners are presented by the Chair of the Presidential Address.⁹

Fisher-Schultz Lecture

The Fisher-Schultz Lecture is an annual lecture given by a non-European member at the European meeting or, in World Congress years, at the World Congress. A list of past lecturers can be found on the Society’s website. The lecture is arranged jointly by both Programme Chairs. The invitation must state that acceptance of the invitation to deliver the lecture implies an invitation to submit a suitable version of the lecture to *Econometrica* (cf. Section 8.2 of the Rules and Procedures of the Econometric Society). The Fisher-Schultz Lecture is a plenary ‘A-session’ of EEA–ESEM, which

typically alternates between TAE and EEE depending on the focus of the Presidential Lecture. There are no discussants of the Fisher-Schultz Lecture.

It has been decided in 2014 that newly elected fellows in the European region would be presented and honoured before the Fisher-Schultz Lecture in the years in which there is no World Congress.

Laffont Lecture

The Laffont Lecture is arranged jointly by both Programme Chairs. Preferably, it is at the interface of TAE and EEE. The Laffont Lecture is a plenary ‘A-session’ of EEA–ESEM and has no discussants. The lecture is currently sponsored by the Toulouse School of Economics. The sponsorship should be indicated in the Conference Programme.

Parallel Invited Sessions

In addition to the plenary ‘A-sessions’, there are usually three ‘B-sessions’ with invited speakers at EEA–ESEM. These are parallel in TAE and EEE, and take place at the same time as the EEA invited sessions. In recent years there were two hours for each session and two invited speakers per session. The session titles are chosen by the respective Programme Chair.

ES Lunchtime Session

The Programme Chairs decide whether they wish to organize a lunchtime session. As a rule, the ES, the EEA and the LAC are allocated one such session each.

2.3 Contributed Sessions

- 1.** The Programme Chairs handle all matters related to the submissions of papers contributed for presentation at ESEM. The sole criterion for acceptance of a paper shall be its scientific merit. The Programme Chairs appoint as many members to the Programme Committee as considered appropriate. Starting in 2012, the TAE and EEE programme committees have been replaced by a joint committee.
- 2.** The number of parallel sessions in the Contributed Sessions should be approximately equal for the EEA and ESEM parts. This should achieve the desirable effect that the quality of contributed papers does not differ too much between EEA and ESEM sessions. The number of parallel sessions should remain within the range 16-20 for each of the two organisations. Intertemporal variation in the exact number should reflect physical capacity constraints and popularity of the venue.
- 3.** Each author may submit only one paper to the EEA Congress and only one paper to the ESEM; the same paper may not be submitted to both the EEA Congress and the ESEM. The corresponding author of any paper submitted to ESEM must be a member at the time the paper is submitted. The membership requirement must be prominently displayed in the Call for Papers. The Programme Chairs are assisted by the Society’s General Manager in checking the membership status of submissions.
- 4.** In the years 2002–2014, the processing of papers contributed to ESEM was handled electronically through the congress organisation software WebMeets. Since 2016, the web-based interface Conference Maker has been used.

5. In recent years, the usual timetable for submissions has been as follows: (a) Complete submissions must be received by February 15. (b) Decisions on submissions are made by April 15. (c) Accepted papers are only included in the final programme if presenting authors have registered by May 15.

2.4 Other Events

Meeting of the Executive Committee

The Executive Vice-President arranges the Meetings of the Executive Committee of the Econometric Society. The Executive Committee meets at least once a year, normally at the site of ESEM. Usually, the meeting begins on the day before the first day of sessions around lunchtime and is continued on the next morning.

Meeting of the European Standing Committee

The Meeting of the European Standing Committee is prepared by its Secretary. Usually it meets during ESEM around lunchtime on the first day of sessions shortly after the Meeting of the Executive Committee ends. The Chair, the Secretary and the Treasurer of the Committee usually hold a preparatory meeting about one hour before the Meeting starts.

Meeting of Members

The Meeting of Members traditionally took place immediately after the Presidential Address, usually in the same location. It was chaired by the President of the Society, or in his/her absence, by the Chair of the European Standing Committee. The Programme Chairs and the current and future Local Arrangements Chair were expected to attend the meeting to provide information about their arrangements.

In 2018, the European Standing Committee decided to suspend the ES Members Meeting, starting with ESEM 2019.

Meeting of Co-Editors of *Econometrica*

The Meeting of Co-Editors is arranged by the Editor of *Econometrica*.

Women in Economics (WinE)

WinE organizes a yearly mentoring event for female economists the day before the EEA/ESEM starts. Senior female economist mentors run a series of interactive meetings and lectures with female postdocs and assistant professors in economics. It is run as a separate event from EEA/ESEM and is co-chaired by a representative of each association. This representative is proposed to the Standing Committee by a search committee organized by the Chair.¹⁰

Lunch/Dinner for Programme Committee Members

Usually the Programme Chairs arrange a lunch or dinner for the members of the Programme Committee in coordination with the Local Arrangements Chair.

Griliches, Hotelling and Sargan Lectures

The Executive Committee of the Econometric Society decided in 2015 to create three new series of named lectures to be given annually from 2016 on: the Griliches Lectures in Applied Economics, the Hotelling Lectures in Economic Theory, and the Sargan Lectures in Econometrics. These lectures rotate across regional meetings. Speakers are selected by a special committee of the Econometric Society.

The lectures are meant to present an overview of a topic in which the lecturers have done significant research. They will typically be above PhD level, but not necessarily frontier research. The lectures will take place over one or two days, preferably immediately before the beginning or after the end of the corresponding regional meeting. Attendance will be open to all members of the Society. The lectures are to be subsequently published by the Society subject to the Monograph Editors' approval. However, those invited to deliver the lectures will have the option of choosing not to submit their lectures for publication.

It was agreed with the European Economic Association that these lectures will always be given on the Friday of the EEA-ESEM Congress. Starting with Lisbon 2017, no contributed sessions are scheduled on this day.

3 European Winter Meeting (EWMES)

3.1 Scope of the Meeting

1. The general aim of the European Winter Meeting of the Econometric Society is to promote the quality of the work of young researchers in economics and econometrics who got their PhD in Europe. This meeting has a distinct identity with three foci: scientific work of the best quality, young researchers with an emphasis on PhD students on the job market and close interaction between junior and senior researchers.

2. For more than fifty years, the European Winter Meetings of the Econometric Society have fostered interaction among a small group of young scholars, who presented their work by invitation, and a group of senior academics representing different regions and fields of specialization. Many of today's leading European economists kick-started their careers at one of these meetings. At the turn of the century, the meetings began to focus on PhD students close to finishing their thesis. In 2013, the European Standing Committee of the Econometric Society decided to widen the scope of the meetings with an open call for submissions without any regional stratification.

In 2018, the European Standing Committee declared the general policy that non-presenters can register for the Winter Meeting at the prevailing fee. The call for papers and the acceptance and rejection messages to paper submitters should say so explicitly.

3.2 Timing and Format

1. The Meetings take place during two full days in early December.¹¹ The scientific programme is organized by one Programme Chair and one Local Arrangements Chair who are proposed by the Chair at least one year and a half in advance. They are appointed by the Regional Standing Committee at its summer meeting a year and a half in advance i.e. during summer t-1.

2. The Programme Chair chooses Programme Committee Members¹² who are responsible for the selection process (see below) and who commit to attend the winter meeting and chair the sessions they organized. Programme Committee Members can organize sessions as they see fit within the perimeter defined by scientific work of the best quality, young researchers with an emphasis on PhD students on the job market and close interaction between junior and senior researchers.

3. The Programme and Local Chairs prepare a joint report to be discussed at the summer meeting of the Regional Standing Committee of year t . They also report to the Regional Standing Committee after the meeting at the latest in March of year $t + 1$.

3.3 Selection Process

1. The Programme Committee invites submissions of papers, which can be either complete or work in progress. Submissions can be made between mid June and mid September before the meeting. They can be directed to a specific Programme Committee member. Decisions on the programme are announced around mid-October. Paper presenters must register for the meeting by early November.

2. Each person may submit and present one paper only. However, each person may be the co-author of several papers submitted to the conference. The submitting author must be a member of the Econometric Society or must join prior to submission.

3. Programme Committee members take responsibility for organizing and chairing the contributed sessions. They will also provide comments and foster interaction across research fields.
